OLD BUSINESS (PUBLIC SPEAKS): None

PUBLIC SPEAKS (CITY BUSINESS): Vicki Boatright came with the Ohio District 7 Indivisible Team and Action Together Stark to speak against the House of Representatives voting to destroy the Affordable Health Care Act. She feels the health care bill which they voted for has no redeeming value. Congressman Bob Gibbs, her own Representative, voted for this bill, which will strip thousands of his own constituents of the right to affordable health care, and afterwards celebrated at a beer party. She feels, however, that many people in the Canton community do care about health care, as well as City Council, and asked Council to consider passing a Resolution supporting the right of every American Citizen to affordable health care. She feels it will be a strong message to Congress. Judy Alsip also spoke about the Affordable Health Care Act. Her son was diagnosed with cancer as a child, and now with the potential passing of the new health care act, he may be forced to purchase high risk insurance. She fears he may go through his life not able to afford the proper care he may need. Congressman Brooks stated that the new health care act will allow insurance companies to charge people like her son more because it reduces the cost to people who have done things to keep themselves healthy. Her son did nothing to cause his cancer. The public has had no chance to review or analyze this latest health care bill, which she feels is no way to govern. She also encouraged Council to pass a Resolution against the AHCA. Mary Beth Medford also encouraged Council to pass a Resolution supporting the original health care act. Last week, Bob Gibbs and Jim Renacci, along with the President, voted to repeal the Affordable Health Care Act and replace it with the American Health Care Act, which has not received a CBO report and was made public less than 24 hours before passage. The bill includes many cuts, one of which is Medicaid funding to the states, for which states like Ohio will have to make up the difference. The Kaiser Family Foundation estimated 24 million Americans will lose health care insurance under this new plan. Premiums for pre-existing conditions could significantly increase. She feels local representatives have turned a deaf ear to their constituents. She again asked Council to vote in favor of a Resolution to support the Affordable Health Care Act. Richard Manson described an encounter with the Canton police when he was riding his bike. He feels they showed him disrespect, and threatened to arrest him when he tried to explain himself. He did speak with Chief Lawver about it, and suggested that police officers may need ongoing training regarding controlling situations and not escalating them. Patricia Kirk spoke about the hope filled comments she heard last week from the Marathon runners and the events on April 28th for Canton's Arbor Day at the Garden Center. She inquired when she may find out what is going to happen to the Kresge lot, as the landscaper does not want to continue work on a lot that may not remain a park.

Member Morris asked Member Mariol when he was going to say something mean because he's such a nice guy. He feels the proper way to say it is to tell the two jackasses to come down here and apologize. Law Director Martuccio indicated that because he cannot vote on Informal Resolutions, he would like to add this thought from Charles Dickens.
