AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO: ENTER INTO AN AMENDMENT TO THE GEORGETOWN ROAD COOPERATIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH CANTON TOWNSHIP; TAKE ANY STEPS NECESSARY TO ANNEX THE EAST LANE OF WHIPPLE AVE. SW BETWEEN WEST TUSCARAWAS STREET AND 13<sup>TH</sup> STREET THAT IS NOT ALREADY WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS; AND TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT AND/OR ANY OTHER NECESSARY AGREEMENTS FOR THE RESURFACING OF WHIPPLE AVE. SW BETWEEN WEST TUSCARAWAS STREET AND 13<sup>TH</sup> STREET SW; AND DECLARING THE SAME TO BE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANTON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor or Director of Public Service, on behalf of the city of Canton, is authorized and directed to enter into an amendment to the Georgetown Road Cooperative Economic Development Agreement (CEDA) with Canton Township to remove the City's maintenance responsibility of Broad Ave. NW north of the City's border.

Section 2. The Mayor or Director of Public Service, on behalf of the city of Canton, is further authorized and directed to take any steps necessary to annex the east lane of Whipple Ave. SW between West Tuscarawas Street and 13<sup>th</sup> Street that is not already within the city limits.

Section 3. The Mayor or Director of Public Service, on behalf of the city of Canton, is further authorized and directed to enter into a cooperative agreement and/or any other necessary agreements for the resurfacing of Whipple Ave. SW between West Tuscarawas Street and 13th Street SW.

Section 4. The Auditor is authorized and directed to draw his warrants upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.

Section 5. The Clerk of Council is authorized to correct any typographical errors discovered herein during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. The City has been working with both Perry and Canton Townships in order to resolve two longstanding roadway ownership and maintenance issues. Currently, the City is responsible for paving and maintenance of Broad Ave. NW just north of 13th Street to 17th Street NW despite it remaining in Canton Township and serving only Township residents. This arrangement was part of an amendment to the Georgetown Road CEDA approved in 2012. Conversely, Canton Township currently owns and maintains the majority of the eastern half of Whipple Ave. SW from West Tuscarawas Street to 13th Street SW. This section of roadway is only bordered by City residents. Pending Council approval, we have agreed to "swap" responsibilities for these sections of Whipple and Broad so that each political subdivision is responsible for the section of roadway that serves their respective residents. This will be done by amending the Georgetown CEDA to remove the City's responsibility for Broad Ave. and by annexing the Section of Whipple Ave. not already within our corporation limits.

Moving forward, we would like to pave Whipple Ave. SW. However, post annexation, we will only own and be responsible for the eastern lane as the western portion of the road will remain largely in Perry Township. As a result, we have been in talks with Perry Township regarding a cooperative agreement whereas we will include both lanes of Whipple in the 2025 paving program. Perry Township will then reimburse us for our expenses which are estimated to be \$57,000.00.

It is our opinion this is a good arrangement for all parties and will clean up two longstanding roadway issues that in practice do not work for our respective residents.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- Authorizes the Mayor and/or Director of Public Service to enter into an amendment to the Georgetown Road Cooperative Economic Development Agreement (CEDA) with Canton Township to remove the City's maintenance responsibility of Broad Ave. NW north of the City's border.





RE: Request for Legislation - Establishment of a City Stormwater Utility

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

One of the critical public resources managed by the City's service departments is the stormwater drainage system that includes City-owned storm sewers, ditches, culverts, detention/retention basins, and other related components. The ability to properly manage stormwater runoff is a critical public need from multiple perspectives. Proper drainage ensures that both the quantity and quality of stormwater runoff from public and private property is properly managed before entering our local waterways. At present, the City of Canton largely funds the construction and maintenance of the stormwater drainage system out of the Capital and Street Maintenance accounts. These are the primary funds that go towards other critical items such as road repaving, bridge repair, and building maintenance. Given the needs in these areas, we are often times faced with difficult situations and the distribution of limited resources. This has unfortunately led to a situation where the stormwater drainage system has been sacrificed and underfunded.

The Engineering Department has reviewed their historical stormwater records dating back to the mid-1980s. Over the last 40 years or so, multiple issues have been brought to light and studies performed which indicate that additional storm sewer or drainage infrastructure is needed. If all of these deferred projects are added together, they represent more than \$66 million in recommended improvements. Furthermore, the issue of funding drainage is not limited to the construction of new storm sewers and other drainage infrastructure. Much of the City does already have storm sewers in place. However, more than 75% of the sewers are over 50 years old. Some have already begun to fail, while others are going to begin to fail which will only exacerbate the issue. Thus, in reality, stormwater drainage needs easily exceed \$66 million.

At this time, the City's leadership has determined that it would be prudent to begin taking steps to address what is outlined above. Many communities, with several being local to Stark County, have established a stormwater utility fee. What this does is generate a dedicated funding source to be spent on building and maintaining the City's stormwater drainage system. At this time, we are proposing an initial fixed fee of \$3.75 per month for each single, double, and triple-family residential parcel within the City beginning on January 1, 2026. For other sites, the Engineering Department has determined an Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) calculation based on the average impervious surface present at a single-family residential location. They would then be charged the \$3.75 per ERU fee per site up to a maximum of \$325.00 per month per site. Additionally, non-single-family sites would be able to receive a credit of up to 10% of their bill for stormwater quantity management and 10% for stormwater quality management with the goal being to encourage sites to properly manage their stormwater. In total, we are estimating that this fee would generate just over \$2 million annually. Although this will not magically fix the issues overnight, it will give the City a dedicated funding source to begin systematically addressing the stormwater drainage system needs.

Assessment and collection of water rents – see Ohio R.C. 743.04

### 965.01 STORMWATER UTILITY GENERALLY

It is hereby declared necessary for the protection of the public health, safety, welfare and convenience of the City and its inhabitants to codify the establishment of a stormwater utility and to codify just and equitable rates or charges to be paid to the City which shall be used solely to fund the costs of the management, maintenance, operation, repair, design, planning, regulation, education, inspection, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, expansion, replacement, enforcement and related costs of the City's stormwater drainage system and items relating to the City's compliance with mandates by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System as administered through the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA).

### 965.02 FINDINGS, DETERMINATIONS AND POWER

It is hereby determined that those elements of the stormwater drainage system which provide for the collection, treatment and discharge of stormwater runoff are of benefit and provide services to all property within the incorporated City limits. The beneficiaries of the system include all real properties within the City which benefit by the provision, operation and improvement of the system. Such benefits may include, but are not limited to, the provision of systems of collection, conveyance, detention, treatment and discharge of stormwater runoff, the reduction of hazard to property and life resulting from stormwater runoff, improvement in general health and welfare through reduction of undesirable stormwater runoff conditions, and improvement to the quality of stormwater runoff in the City's stormwater drainage systems and the receiving surface waters.

The stormwater utility shall be under the control of the Director, who has the power to:

- (a) Prepare regulations as needed to implement this Chapter, and adopt such policies and procedures as are required to implement said regulations or carry out other responsibilities of the utility.
- (b) Administer the acquisition, design, construction, maintenance and operation of the utility system, including capital improvements.
- (c) Administer and enforce this Chapter and all regulations and procedures adopted relating to the design, construction, maintenance, operation and alteration of the utility system including, but not limited to, the quantity, quality and/or discharge rates of the storm water conveyed thereby.
- (d) Advise Canton City Council, the City administration and City departments on matters relating to the utility.
- (e) Administer the review, approval, or denial of plans related to the management of stormwater runoff as well as the inspection and acceptance of modifications and/or extensions to the stormwater drainage system.
- (f) Establish and enforce regulations to improve, protect and maintain stormwater quantity and quality within the stormwater drainage system in compliance with standards established by the city, state, regional and/or federal agencies as now adopted or hereafter amended.
- (g) Analyze the cost of services and benefits provided, and the system and structure of fees, charges, fines and other revenues of the stormwater utility annually.

### 965.03 DEFINITIONS

As used in this chapter:

- (a) "Apartment building" means a building which consists of housing units for rent where the land or lot beneath the multi-dwelling structure is owned by the building owner.
  - (b) "City" means the City of Canton, Ohio.
- (c) "CPI" or "Consumer Price Index" for purposes of this chapter means the Consumer Price Index All Urban Consumers U.S. City Average All Items (current series) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor.
- (d) "Common area" means a property which is privately owned by an individual or an entity such as a homeowners association or property owners association, but is available for use by all tenants, groups of tenants, or their invitees within a residential or commercial development.
- (e) "Condominium" means a dwelling unit which is detached or attached to one or more other dwelling units, wherein the land or lot beneath each dwelling may be individually owned, while common areas are privately owned by a condominium association.
- (f) "Costs of construction" means costs reasonably incurred in connection with providing capital improvements to the storm system or any portion thereof, including, but not limited to, the costs of:

- (1) Acquisition of all property, real or personal, and all interests in connection therewith including all rights-of-way and easements therefore.
- (2) Physical construction, installation and testing, including the costs of labor, services, materials, supplies and construction services used in connection therewith.
  - (3) Architectural, engineering, legal and other professional services.
- (4) Insurance premiums taken out and maintained during construction, to the extent not paid for by a contractor for construction and installation.
  - (5) Any taxes or other charges which become due during construction.
- (6) Expenses incurred by the City or on its behalf with its approval in seeking to enforce any remedy against contractor or sub-contractor in respect of any default under a contract relating to construction.
  - (7) Principal or interest of any bonds.
  - (8) Miscellaneous expenses incidental thereto.
- (g) "Credit" means a reduction in stormwater fee on a parcel or site due to the implementation of stormwater quantity and/or stormwater quality best management practices that have been approved by the City.
- (h) "Developed property" means that which has been altered from its natural state by the removal of vegetation and/or topsoil or by the addition of any improvements such as a building, structure, impervious surface, change of grade, or landscaping. For new construction, a property shall be considered developed pursuant to this chapter:
- (1) Upon issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy, or upon completion of construction of final inspection if no such certificate is issued; or
- (2) Where construction is at least fifty percent (50%) complete and construction is halted for a period of three months.
- (3) Where vegetation and/or topsoil have been removed leaving exposed soil surfaces for a period of three months.
- (i) "Double-family residential property" means a property designed for or occupied by two families entirely surrounded by yard on the same lot. In the application of stormwater utility fees, the property shall be charged one ERU, billable to the property owner.
  - (j) "Director" means the Director of Public Service, or their designee.
- (k) "Dwelling unit" means any residential space for habitation as classified by the City Building Code.
- (l) "Equivalent residential unit (ERU)" means the average impervious surface area (measured in square feet) determined to represent each single, double, and triple-family residential property in the City. The initial area per ERU is 2,750 square feet, subject to revisions per 965.04(e)(5). This amount may be updated as needed by the Director of Public Service or their designee. The

ERU shall be used as the basis for determining stormwater utility fees, for all property sites in the City.

- (m) "Exempt property" means any public right-of-way, public street, public alley, public sidewalk, and all land owned by the Federal government, the State of Ohio, and political subdivisions of the State of Ohio.
- (n) "Extension" and "Replacement" means costs of extensions, additions and capital improvements to, or the renewal and replacement of capital assets of, or purchasing and installing new equipment for, the system, or land acquisitions for the system and any related costs thereto, or paying extraordinary maintenance, including the costs of construction, or any other expenses which are not costs of operation and maintenance or debt service.
- (o) "Impervious area" and "Impervious surface" means a horizontal surface that has been compacted or covered with a layer of material so that it is highly resistant to infiltration by water. It includes, but is not limited to, semi-pervious surfaces such as compacted clay or gravel, unvegetated and under vegetated solid surfaces, as well as streets, roofs, sidewalks, patios, porches, parking lots, athletic courts and other similar surfaces, which may include but are not limited to concrete, asphalt, and blacktop.
- (p) "Multi-family residential property" means a property designed for or occupied by more than three families entirely surrounded by yard on the same lot. In the application of stormwater utility fees, the property shall be charged in accordance with the same provisions of a non-residential property, billable to the property owner.
- (q) "Non-residential property" means all properties not encompassed by the definition of residential property. In the application of stormwater utility fees, total property impervious area will be divided by the area of one ERU to calculate ERUs for each non-residential property.
- (r) "Operations and maintenance" means the current expenses, paid or accrued, of operation, maintenance and current repair of the system, as calculated in accordance with sound accounting practice, and includes, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, insurance premiums, administrative expenses, labor, executive compensation, and cost of materials and supplies used for current operations, and charges for the accumulation of appropriate reserves for current expenses not annually incurred, but which are such as may reasonably be expected to be incurred in accordance with sound accounting practice.
- (s) "Residential property" means property which serves the primary purpose of providing a permanent dwelling unit to a family or families.
- (t) "Revenues" mean all rates, fees, assessments, rental or other charges or other income received by the Stormwater Drainage Fund, in connection with the management and operation of the system, including amounts received from the investment or deposit of moneys in any fund or account and any amounts contributed by the City, all as calculated in accordance with sound accounting practice.
- (u) "Single family residential property" means a property designed for or occupied by one family entirely surrounded by yard on the same lot.

- (v) "Site" means two or more contiguous parcels having the same owner and collectively functioning for the same common purpose, grouped together in the City's utility billing system for the purpose of assigning one storm water fee representing all respective parcels that make up the site.
- (w) "Stormwater drainage system" or "system" means the existing stormwater drainage infrastructure of the City and all improvements thereto which by this Chapter are constituted as the property and responsibility of the City, to be operated as an enterprise fund to, among other things, convey stormwater, manage discharges necessitated by rainfall events, incorporate methods to collect, convey, store, absorb, inhibit, treat, use or reuse water to present or reduce flooding, over-drainage, environmental degradation and water pollution or otherwise affect the quality and quantity of discharge from such system.
- (x) "Stormwater fee" means a fee authorized by ordinance(s) established to pay operations and maintenance, management of the quantity and quality, extension, replacement, and debt service of the stormwater drainage system.
- (y) "Stormwater fee schedule" means the documented, approved, and applicable stormwater fee corresponding to one Equivalent Residential Unit, the associated impervious surface area measurement determined to represent one Equivalent Residential Unit, and the maximum stormwater fee that may be applied to a parcel or site.
- (z) "Stormwater drainage fund" means the enterprise fund created by Canton City Council to operate, maintain and improve the system and for such other purposes as stated in this Chapter.
- (aa) "Triple-family residential property" means a property designed for or occupied by three families entirely surrounded by yard on the same lot. In the application of stormwater utility fees, the property shall be charged one ERU, billable to the property owner.
- (ab) "Undeveloped property" means real property within the corporation limits of the City and which does not meet the definition of "developed property" per this chapter and is considered to have no impervious surface.

### 965.04 STORMWATER FEE

Each customer whose developed property lies within the corporate limits of the City shall pay to the City the base rate per equivalent residential unit (ERU) for each parcel associated with the customer's property.

- (a) Base Rate. The initial base rate for the stormwater utility shall be \$3.75 per ERU per month and shall go into effect as of January 1, 2026. The base rate is subject to revisions per 965.04(e)(4).
- (b) Property Classification. For the purposes of determining the stormwater user fees, all properties in the City shall be classified into one of the following classes and will be assigned an ERU per parcel as set forth herein:
- (1) Single family residential properties shall be charged one ERU per month. This classification includes each residential unit within condominium developments. For

condominiums, each property or site owner shall be responsible for payment. Privately-owned common areas within condominium developments are classified under "Non-residential Property," to be billed as described herein.

- (2) Double or triple-family residential properties shall be charged one ERU per parcel or site. This classification does not apply to multifamily residential properties and apartment buildings.
- (3) Multi-family residential properties are classified under "Non-residential Property", to be billed as described herein.
- (4) Non-residential properties shall be charged the appropriate fee as determined by the total square footage of impervious surface area on the subject parcel or site, divided by the defined square footage of an ERU, times the cost per one ERU. A minimum of one ERU shall be charged.
- A. Privately-owned common area within developments. A calculated ERU shall be billed to the parcel or site owner as described herein.
- B. Apartment building. A calculated ERU shall be billed to the parcel or site owner as described herein.
  - (5) Undeveloped properties shall be charged zero ERUs.
- A. If a parcel becomes developed, an ERU will be calculated and the parcel will be classified and billed according to the guidelines herein. Stormwater billing will begin the first month in which water service is active at the parcel, or, in the absence of water service, when the parcel becomes developed in accordance with the intent of applicable plans and/or associated permits
  - (6) Exempt properties shall be charged zero ERUs.
- (7) As the City becomes aware of any changes in impervious areas of any developed properties in the City, corresponding ERUs and stormwater fees shall be adjusted accordingly.

### (c) Credits.

(1) Stormwater quantity credit. A credit of up to 10% shall be applied to the stormwater fee for permanent best management practices that have been installed on a property and approved by the City for the purpose of storm water quantity management designed to satisfy applicable regulations. Credits shall be applied as follows:

Percentage of Parcel or Site Area Managed by Storm Water Practice	% Credit
1% - 10%	1%
11% - 20%	2%
21% - 30%	3%
31% - 40%	4%

41% - 50%	5%
51% - 60%	6%
61% - 70%	7%
71% - 80%	8%
81% - 90%	9%
91% - 100%	10%

(2) Stormwater quality credit. A credit of up to 10% shall be applied to the stormwater fee for permanent best management practices that have been installed on a property and approved by the City or other regulatory authority for the purpose of storm water quality management designed to satisfy applicable regulations. Credits shall be applied as follows:

Percentage of Parcel or Site Area Managed by Storm Water Practice	
1% - 10%	1%
11% - 20%	2%
21% - 30%	3%
31% - 40%	4%
41% - 50%	5%
51% - 60%	6%
61% - 70%	7%
71% - 80%	8%
81% - 90%	9%
91% - 100%	10%

- (3) Credits shall not exceed 20% in total for a respective parcel's or site's stormwater fee.
- (4) Single, double, and triple-family residential properties are not eligible to receive credits to their respective stormwater fees. Only non-residential properties are eligible for credits.
- (5) Approved credits shall be applied to the fee after the maximum cap, if applicable.

- (d) Maximum fee. The fee applied per non-residential parcel or site shall be capped at a maximum of \$325.00 per month but shall be adjusted accordingly based on review of rates in accordance with section 965.04(e).
- (e) Review of Rates. The City shall annually review the stormwater service charges and revise the charges as necessary to ensure the following:
- (1) That revenues, as determined herein, for the maintenance and operation of the stormwater drainage system are generated; and
- (2) That stormwater service charges continue to distribute the costs of maintenance and operation of the stormwater drainage system and other related stormwater management function of the City in proportion to the users' contribution of stormwater runoff.
- (3) The City Engineer shall, annually, on or before February 1, submit to the Director a statement of the cost of living adjustment based upon the CPI. Annually, on or before March 1, the Director shall submit to Canton City Council the proposed stormwater fee schedule for the ensuing year, including the CPI annual cost of living adjustment.
- (4) If Canton City Council finds that the proposed stormwater fee schedule for the ensuing year, including the cost of living adjustment based upon the change in the CPI, is insufficient to meet the needs and requirements of the City for the maintenance, operation and repair of the stormwater drainage system for the ensuing year or if Canton City Council finds that the cost of living adjustment based upon change in the CPI is otherwise inconsistent with the needs and requirements of the City for the operation, maintenance and repair of the City stormwater drainage system, Canton City Council shall pass an ordinance to amend or modify the proposed adjusted stormwater fees accordingly. However, if Canton City Council takes no action by ordinance for the further modification or amendment of the proposed stormwater fees, including the cost of living adjustment, as submitted by the Director, then the proposed stormwater fee schedule shall automatically go into force and effect forty-five (45) days after the submission of said schedule by the Director.
- (5) Periodically, the City Engineer may assess the ERU to determine if it needs updated. If an update is needed, the Engineer shall notify the Director who shall notify Canton City Council. If Canton City Council takes no action by ordinance for the further modification or amendment of the ERU as submitted by the Director, then the proposed ERU shall automatically go into force and effect forty-five (45) days after the submission of said schedule by the Director.

### 965.05 STORMWATER FEE COLLECTION; FEE TO CONSTITUTE A LIEN

- (a) The fee provided in Section 965.04 shall be the responsibility of the property owner of each parcel or site, as applicable, and shall be listed as a separate line item on the combined utility bill. For those properties within the corporate limits of the City that do not utilize the City's water, sewer, or sanitation services, the property owner shall be billed separately for the fee.
- (b) Bills shall be rendered monthly or bimonthly, at the discretion of the Director. The Director may set and charge a reasonable late fee for payments that are not received prior to the established due date. Each stormwater charge authorized and levied by this chapter shall be the responsibility of the owner of record of the property served and is hereby made a lien upon the

premises charged therewith, and shall, if not paid within thirty (30) days thereafter, it shall be certified to the Stark County Auditor, who shall place the same on the tax duplicate with the interest and penalties allowed by law and be collected.

(c) Additionally, the Director may place any delinquent amounts due under this chapter with a third-party agent, including, but not limited to, a law firm or collection agency. Any such delinquent account shall be assessed a collection fee, equal to the fee charged by the third party, as set forth in the third party's contract with the City. The resulting balance due on the account shall be the principal balance due, plus interest penalties, late fees and/or other permissible fines or charged, and the collection fee. The assessment of the collection fee shall be made by the third party at the time the account is place by the City with said third party. Additionally, any court costs incurred in relation to all delinquent accounts shall also be added to the total balance due.

### 965.06 STORMWATER DRAINAGE FUND

The revenues received pursuant to this Chapter 965 shall be deposited and kept in a separate and distinct fund known as the Stormwater Drainage Fund. The Stormwater Drainage Fund shall be used for the payment of the cost of items, including the salary of City employees, related to the management, maintenance, operation, repair, design, planning, regulation, education, inspection, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, expansion, replacement, enforcement and related costs of the City's stormwater drainage system and items relating to the City's compliance with mandates by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System as administered through the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA), and for the payment of interest on any indebtedness incurred for the construction thereof, and for the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of such indebtedness, but shall not be used for any other purpose not related to items in this chapter.

### **965.07 DISPUTES**

- (a) Any disputes regarding the stormwater utility fee shall be heard by the Utility Accounts Review Board (Board) established as per Codified Ordinance Chapter 148.
- (b) The Board is authorized to hear appeals regarding disputes and complaints brought by owners and nonowners concerning application of this chapter, including the authority to make adjustments as appropriate to provide relief from a strict application of the provisions of this chapter due to unique circumstances which reduce the burden of operating, constructing, repairing and maintaining the stormwater drainage system and the structures and devices related thereto, while accomplishing the intent of this chapter, to include but not be limited to the following:
- (1) Calculation of the total number of building units assigned to a property that are claimed to be inaccurate due to alleged inaccuracies in data utilized by the billing staff.
- (2) Adjustments arising from a break in billing units due to change in property ownership, account responsibility or similar matters.
- (c) Any appeal must be filed in writing, must describe the specific error alleged, and contain the resolution of said dispute which the appealing party feels is correct. Said Board may request additional information from either the appealing party or the City. The decision of said Board shall be final.

### 965.08 FLOODING; LIABILITY

Floods from stormwater runoff may occasionally occur which exceed the capacity of storm water drainage facilities constructed, operated, or maintained by funds made available under this chapter. This chapter does not imply that property subject to the fees and charges established herein will always be free from storm water flooding or flood damage, or that storm water systems capable of handling all storm events can be cost-effectively constructed, operated, or maintained. Nor shall this chapter create a liability on the part of, or cause of action against, the City or any officer or employee thereof for any flood damage that may result from such storms or the runoff thereof. Nor does this chapter purport to reduce the need or the necessity for obtaining flood insurance.

Dear Madame President and Honorable Members:

In April 2022, an air medical service was requested for an employee's spouse for air flight services from PHI Air Medical. The claim involved two services, and the provider submitted separate Independent Dispute Resolution (IDR) requests to the government, one for each service instead of a single IDR for the entire claim. As a result, UMR was holding payment for one of the service dispute determinations while awaiting the determination for the other.

Unfortunately, due to an internal error at UMR, the payment for the second service was not released for payment. Due to UMRs internal error, the City of Canton is responsible for paying the provider the difference between the OPA and the IDR-determined amount.

UMR argued they were no longer the authorized plan administrator and no longer had access to the City's bank account, therefore, they would not facilitate payment. UMR stated because the City of Canton is a self-funded plan, the payment amount due to the provider remains the City's responsibility. UMR acknowledged the oversight and will cover any penalties or fees incurred due to the delay of payment referenced.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes and directs the Auditor to pay moral obligations for PHI Air Medical amounting to \$23,761 with the passage of this ordinance.
- Retroactively authorizes any actions taken to ensure that the moral obligation in question is paid promptly.
- 3. Authorizes the Auditor to draw warrants upon receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.
- 4. Declares this ordinance to be an emergency measure.

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

Pursuant to Section 105.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Canton, I am hereby advising you of a situation that requires the use of the City's emergency contractual procedures. Several weeks ago, a break was reported in the 8-inch waterline that serves as the primary feed for Cleveland Clinic Mercy Hospital. This line is located approximately 30 feet under I77 and continues under the highway entrance ramp before connecting to the hospital. An initial repair was made, but we now have a second break. Given the obvious importance of this line, it is critical that we make a permanent repair as soon as possible.

Typically, when our formal procurement process is used for a project like this, it could take upwards of a year to complete from start to finish with formal design, approvals, and bidding. Given the criticality of the hospital, we do not have this kind of time. Although the line remains on and pressurized, we do not want to chance the issue worsening. As stated, Cleveland Clinic Mercy does currently have water. Additionally, they do have a redundant secondary feed that runs to the hospital off of 13<sup>th</sup> Street. However, this is a smaller 6-inch line, and pressures would be impacted if this were the only feed.

Multiple options for a repair have been considered, and the quickest, most efficient approach is to perform a Cured in Place Pipe (CIPP) repair. As of today, Tele-Vac Environmental has begun the process to manufacture the pipe liner. It will take approximately two weeks to manufacture the liner and a week to install. If all goes well, the liner should be installed and tested for service as of July 14. The estimated cost for the repair is \$185,000.00.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Ratifies all actions taken prior to the passage of this ordinance pursuant to Section 105.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Canton.
- 2. Authorizes the Mayor and/or the Director of Public Service to enter into any and all contracts necessary to respond to the above emergency situation.
- 3. Authorizes and directs the City of Canton Auditor to pay any and all moral obligations resulting from responding to this emergency situation.

As you are aware and previously approved pursuant to ordinances 236/2024 the City is preparing to reconstruct portions of Sherrick Rd. SE and Gonder Ave. SE sidewalk areas. At this time, the design is substantially complete, and we are now prepared to proceed with the land acquisition process necessary to construct the project. There are six property owners along this project, from which six parcels must be acquired. The property acquisition consists of 3 right-of-way corner takes by standard highway easement, and 3 temporary work agreements; there are no total take parcels and no parcels including the removal of an existing building. The estimated cost for the right-of-way acquisitions is \$1,500. Attached is a list of parcels for your reference.

Therefore, I hereby request legislation that does the following:

- 1. Authorizes the Mayor, Director of Public Service, or their designee, on behalf of the City of Canton, to establish the Fair Market Value (FMV) for the fee simple takes which are necessary for the construction of the project.
- 2. Authorizes the Mayor, Director of Public Service, or their designee, to negotiate with property owners for the purchase/acquisition of their parcels utilizing FMV as the basis of said negotiations, and for the city to accept title to said parcels.
- 3. Authorizes the Mayor and/or Service Director, on behalf of the City of Canton, to negotiate or donate city-owned property for permanent road right-of-way, utility easements and/or temporary construction easements which are necessary for the construction of the project.
- 4. Authorizes the Mayor, Director of Public Service, or their designee, to make ministerial changes to correct property owner names, parcel numbers and other numerical descriptive or typographical errors, should they occur.
- 5. Council declaration of intent to appropriate parcels for the project (as required by Ohio Revised Code 719.04) if a negotiated settlement cannot be reached with parcel owners.
- 6. Authorizes the Auditor to draw warrants upon the receipt of vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority based on the negotiated settlement price agreed to by the property owner and the Mayor, Director of Public Service, or their designee.

Dear Madam President and Honorable Members:

As projects have progressed throughout the bidding and construction cycle, a need to move funds has originated within the Engineering Department's budget. First, we are asking for an additional supplemental appropriation of \$44,298.13 of Capital funds to be placed towards design of the East Tuscarawas Streetscape Phase 3 project. These funds are available due to the fact that we are closing out the purchase order from the design of phase 2 of this project. This will be added to \$50,000.00 that was previously budgeted for this purpose.

Second, we had originally planned on bidding at least a phase of the reconstruction of The O'Jay's Parkway in 2025. However, given the cost of removing buried trolley tracks underneath the road, it has been determined to bid this in 2026 when we will have approximately \$500,000.00 of municipal road funds to put towards the project. Although we could bid a small portion in 2025, it would be significantly limited in scope. Expanding the size of the project and moving forward in 2026 will be a more efficient use of resources. As a result, we are asking to move \$150,000.00 in capital funds from this project in 2025 to Engineering - Administration. These will then be used to do a large contracted crack seal contract on several of our main roads. As is typical, the Public Works Department will continue to crack seal residential areas.
